You are about to purchase a product that is not simple and may be difficult to understand.

1. What is this product?

Type

Irish law governed equity-linked notes / Return depends on the performance of the underlying / No capital protection against market risk

Term

The product has a fixed term and will be due on 17 September 2029, subject to an early redemption.

Objectives

(Terms that appear in **bold** in this section are described in more detail in the table(s) below.)

The product is designed to provide a return in the form of (1) conditional interest payments and (2) a cash payment on termination of the product. The timing and amount of these payments will depend on the performance of the **underlying**. If, at maturity, the **final reference level** of the **underlying** has fallen below the **barrier level**, the product may return less than the **product notional amount** or even zero.

Early termination following an autocall: The product will terminate prior to the **maturity date** if, on any **autocall observation date**, the **reference level** is at or above the **autocall barrier level**. On any such early termination, you will on the immediately following **autocall payment date** receive, in addition to any final interest payment, a cash payment equal to the autocall payment of EUR 1,000.00. <u>Termination on the maturity date</u>: If the product has not terminated early, on the **maturity date** you will receive:

- 1. if the final reference level is at or above the barrier level, a cash payment equal to EUR 1,000; or
- if the final reference level is below the barrier level, a cash payment directly linked to the performance of the underlying.
 The cash payment will equal (i) the product notional amount multiplied by (ii) (A) the final reference level divided by (B) the strike level

Under the product terms, certain dates specified above and below will be adjusted if the respective date is either not a business day or not a trading day (as applicable). Any adjustments may affect the return, if any, you receive.

The product terms also provide that if certain exceptional events occur (1) adjustments may be made to the product and/or (2) the issuer may terminate the product early. These events are specified in the product terms and principally relate to the **underlying**, the product and the issuer. The return (if any) you receive on such early termination is likely to be different from the scenarios described above and may be less than the amount you invested.

- 2. they seek capital growth, expect the movement in the underlying to perform in a way that generates a positive return. They have a medium investment horizon and understand that the product may terminate early;
- 3. they are able to bear a total loss of their initial investment, consistent with the redemption profile of the product at maturity (market risk):
- they accept the risk that the issuer could fail to pay or perform its obligations under the product irrespective of the redemption profile of the product (credit risk);
- 5. they are willing to accept a level of risk of 6 out of 7 to achieve potential returns, which reflects the second highest risk (as shown in the summary risk indicator below which takes into account both market risk and credit risk).

2. What are the risks and what could I get in return?

The risk indicator assumes you keep the product until 17 September 2029. The actual risk can vary significantly if you cash in at an early stage and you may get back less. You may not be able to sell your product easily or may have to sell at a price that significantly impacts on how much you get back.

The summary risk indicator is a guide to the level of risk of this product compared to other products. It shows how likely it is that the product will lose money because of movements in the markets or because we are not able to pay you.

We have classified this product as 6 out of 7, which is the second-highest risk class. This rates the potential losses from future performance of the **underlying** at a high level and the potential for us to be unable to pay you any amounts due as very unlikely. Inflation erodes the purchasing value of cash over time and this may result in the decline in real terms of any capital reimbursed or interest you may be paid under the investment.

This product does not include any protection from future market performance so you could lose some or all of your investment. If we are not able to pay you what is owed, you could lose your entire investment.

The favourable, moderate, unfavourable and stress scenarios represent possible outcomes that have been calculated based on simulations using the past performance of the **underlying** over a period of up to 5 years. In the case of an early redemption, it has been assumed that no reinvestment has occurred. The stress scenario shows what you might get back in extreme market circumstances. This product cannot be easily cashed in. If you exit the investment earlier than the recommended holding period, you may have to pay extra costs.

3. What happens if the manufacturer is unable to pay out?

5. How long should I hold it and can I take money out early?

Recommended holding period: 4 years

The product aims to provide you with the return described under "1. What is this product?" above. However, this only applies if the product is held to maturity. It is therefore recommended that the product is held until 17 September 2029 (maturity), although the product may terminate early.

The product does not guarantee the possibility to disinvest other than by selling the product either (1) through the exchange (if the product is exchange traded) or (2) off-exchange, where an offer for such product exists. Save as otherwise disclosed in exit costs (see section "4. What are the costs?" above), no fees or penalties will be charged by the issuer for any such transaction, however an execution fee might be chargeable by your broker if applicable.
